
1. accede (ak-seed)	(verb) To give consent or approval.
2. accord (uh-khord)	(noun) Official agreement or treaty; harmony.
3. acquiesce (ak-wee-ess)	(verb) To accept or consent silently without protest or enthusiasm.
4. agree	(verb) To consent or concede; to be in harmony; to have the same opinion; to come to an understanding.
5. amendable (uh-mee-nuh-bull)	(adj) Agreeable to suggestions; likely to cooperate; accountable for actions.
6. appeasement (uh-pee-z-ment)	(noun) The act of making others happy by agreeing to their demands.
7. assent (uh-sent)	(noun) Agreement that an opinion, view, or proposal correct; corroboration.
8. collusion (kuh-loo-zhun)	(noun) A conspiratorial or secret understanding or agreement entered into for an illicit or fraudulent end.
9. complaisant (kuhm-play-zuhnt)	(adj) Agreeable and eager to please.
10. conciliatory (kon-sill-ee-ah-tore-ee)	(adj) Reconciling; able to settle a dispute or resolve a conflict in a manner that leaves no hard feelings on either side.
11. conspiracy (kun-speer-uh-see)	(noun) A treacherous plan involving two or more persons; an agreement among conspirators.
12. mollify (mol-uh-fye)	(verb) To soothe, soften in temper; pacify; appease.
13. pacify (pass-uh-fye)	(verb) To appease; bring to a state of peace or calm; tranquilize.
14. palatable (pal-uh-tuh-bull)	(adj) Agreeable; acceptable.
15. placate (play-kayt)	(verb) To reduce the anger of; appease.
